This document is intended as a summary of your assets and how they can be used to participate in Horizon 2020.

Contact: Contact person within your organisation (name + email).		
Basic expertise: Concise description (no more than 3 lines!) summarising your basic research/innovation/development expertise. (This should answer the question: "Tell me in 10 seconds what you can do").		
Expertise in a nutshell: Provide a short name for your expertise.		
Years of expertise: How many years have you been involved in this area.		
Project idea: Short description of your project idea.

Application expertise: What areas (for example: health, energy, climate, transport...) have you worked in?		
End user knowledge: What sort of customers/groups (for example: Associations, Chambers of Commerce, Students, Patients ...) have used or might use the results of your expertise?		
Publications in area: List publications in the area including name of journal, volume/page, title, authors.		
Key Results: The work done in the area that has resulted in something – new method, process, project, knowledge, pilot, demonstration, new customers etc.		
Strategy: What strategy do you have for research and development, innovation and internationalisation.		

<p>Impact: What sort of results have occurred from expertise in the area. Recognition, more projects, more customers, more students...?</p>	
<p>Personnel: Provide a list of who is in your research/innovation/development group and a short description of their education and work. Important to consider continuity, i.e. how the group is involved in continual training.</p>	
<p>State of the art: What is the highest level of general development, as of a device, technique, or scientific field achieved currently done in your group/by you.</p>	
<p>How close are you to the state of the art? On a scale from 1 to 10, where are you/your (research) group compared to the state of the art</p>
